### **From the desk of Ralph Naddeo, our Financial Benefits Counselor:** **Our Turbulent Times**

I'm going to sound like a broken record, but here it goes. This past Saturday, December 6<sup>th</sup> a tragic accident happened in Puyallup at 10:30 PM. It seems seven teens were leaving the scene of a prank that they had pulled. Driving in a SUV with the headlights off, they proceeded to run a red light and T-boned a vehicle on the driver's side. The driver died at the scene. As tragic as this is for all parties involved, especially for the parents who lost their son, let's imagine that one of those teens was your child or a grandchild. I'm sure there will be lawsuits coming out of this accident. This is where you hope the parents of the teen who was driving the SUV have an UMBRELLA LIABILITY POLICY. Without that policy it is more than likely that they can kiss their assets and income goodbye. How do you protect yourself? Go to your Property and Casualty agent and ask for a quote on an umbrella policy to cover your autos, home, boat and or motorcycle. I recommend a \$1,000,000 to \$2,000,000 policy. The policy is inexpensive compared to the peace of mind it will give you. This is especially true for those of you that have teenage drivers.

I don't need to remind you that we are living in a very challenging economic time. A good percentage of the 401Ks and IRAs are down 20/30/40% or more. From my own experience it is going to take some time for these accounts to get back to where they were a year ago. When we get back to stable economic times it would be a good idea to start adding permanent life insurance and annuities to your financial plan. Let these instruments be the bedrock of your financial plan. A well designed life insurance policy and or annuity will not be down during these times but up by 3 to 5% minimum. If funds are needed all one has to do is call the insurance company and ask how much can I borrow? The use of permanent life insurance and annuities is used by the large financial institutions in BILLIONS of dollars. Why is it we put our faith in the stock market and they put theirs in life insurance companies? I'm not saying don't have stocks and mutual funds, but these should not constitute your whole financial plan.

Let's end on a happy note. I wish all of you a Very Merry Christmas and may your New Year be healthy and prosperous.
