### Mid-sommer Fest

The Sons of Norway lodge is teaming once again with the Historic Downtown Poulsbo Association for the Mid-sommer Fest on June 20, 2009 at Liberty Bay Park. The celebration begins at 3:00 pm with the sounding of the Lur by Bill Fulton. The Lur is a traditional Norwegian horn not often heard in the United States. Our Vestre Sund Mannskor (Poulsbo's Norwegian Men's Chorus) will present a selection of traditional Norwegian songs. Flag-decorated boats, a traditional part of most Norwegian celebrations, will bring musicians to the waterfront this year. There will be a procession to Kvelstad Pavilion where there will be folk dance demonstrations and raising of the Maistang. Everyone will be invited to dance around the Maistang. During the event the Viking Village re-enactors offer a glimpse of Viking life including the games their children played. Flowers and ribbons will be available and everyone is encouraged to make a wreath. Norwegian fjord horses and Norwegian buhund dogs will be on display and more games and face painting will be available at times during the afternoon.

Traditional Norwegian fare including rommegrot, pea soup, vaffler, and lefse will be served in the lodge's Viking Room on the lower level next to the Troll's Den.

To conclude the annual celebration the Poulsbo Vikings will present their torchlight procession, bonfire lighting, and Mid-sommer proclamation. Come join in the singing around the bonfire and celebrate the longest day of the year!

**On Sunday, June 7th**, "Kristin Lavransdatter" will be shown in the Trolls Den beginning at 1 pm. The film is based on the classic novel by Sigrid Undset. It is in Norwegian with English subtitles and is 183 minutes long. Please bring your own lunch or snacks.

**On Sunday, June 14th**, a video will be shown in the Marine Room at 2 pm, "The Ensilage Harvester and the Farmall System". Adolph Ronning was an inventor, manufacturer, research engineer, and father of the Farmall "Horseless Farming" system. This film highlights Ronning's accomplishments through a presentation of his own films, narrated by his daughter, Hildur Adair Ronning Kelley. Included in this volume is exclusive footage of Ronning's Ensilage Harvester and the Farmall tractor which would eventually be licensed to the International Harvester Company. Also included are rare sales films from Ronning and International Harvester, unseen since the silent movie days. Ronning was given a Minnesota commemorative medallion on the anniversary of their 150 years of statehood.

traditional folk dance group from Kongsberg in Buskerud County west of Oslo. Kongsberg is a small town of about 24,000 and is well known for its old silver mines. Today it is a fast growing high-tech engineering town with multinational businesses. The dance group first performed for Kongsberg's 300th anniversary in 1924 and they are celebrating their 85th anniversary with a visit to the United States. They will be performing in Portland, Oregon on August 8th and then will come to Gig Harbor, Poulsbo, and Seattle before leaving the Northwest.

## **Local Norwegians Open Time Capsule!**

A time capsule possibly containing mementos and unknown treasures from decades ago will be opened at 3:00 pm on June 7th at the Leif Erikson hall Lodge 2-001 in Ballard. The capsule was discovered when the former Norway Center building was being demolished and the President of the Leif Erikson Lodge and the retired Consul of the Royal Norwegian Consulate were called in and given the capsule and the corner stone of the building, which had first been set in 1915.

June 7th was selected as the day to unseal and open the time capsule because of its special place in Norway's history. On June 7th, 1905 the people dissolved their union with Sweden and the country of Norway was born. Continuing the tradition, June 7th was the date the King of Norway left his country in 1940 because of World War II and was also the date he returned to Norway in 1945.

## **Norsk Folkedans Stemne**

The Leikarringen BUL Kongsberg will be welcomed at Camp Brotherhood near Mt Vernon on August 14th, 15th, and 16th. Learning and sharing Norwegian dancing and music with folk

dancing groups of all ages from Norway, Canada and the United States are the primary purposes of Norsk Folkedans Stemne. Because of the interest in *halling* or *laus dans*, there will be special instruction for the young and limber. The *halling* allows the performer to show off his flexibility, dance ability, and athletic ability with gymnastic steps done to rhythmic music. In the final moments of the dance, the man kicks off a hat dangling at the end of a pole held at least six to eight feet from the floor. ## **100th Anniversary Update**

2009 is part of two 100th anniversaries this year! The Alaska-Yukon-Exposition took place in Seattle in 1909 and we are also celebrating the birth of District 2 of the Sons of Norway. Through songs such as *Hil dig Norge*, *Naar fjordene blaaner* and *Astri mi Astri*, we celebrate our Norwegian heritage. We also enjoy songs in English such as *My Heart's in the Highlands* and *Battle Hymn of the Republic*.

Our Vestre Sund Mannskor is a chapter of the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association, which has choruses along the entire West Coast from San Diego to Bellingham. Each year the choruses join together for a Sangerfest. This year's event is the 100th Sangerfest and it will be held June 25th to 27th in Eugene, Oregon. It culminates with the Grand Concert on Friday evening at the Eugene Hilton. We hope you'll join us!!
