CHANGE

It seems that, as things change over time, they have a tendency to stay the same. We have just experienced one of the biggest financial meltdowns in history. Only the Great Depression beats it. Those that have 401ks, IRAs, brokerage accounts DON'T want to open their statements when they receive them. Most have suffered great losses; some up to 60%. It may take years to get back up to pre-2008 levels, but even if we do get back, we have lost value due to inflation and taxes. Now comes the good part. To help us recover we are hearing the same old statements before 2008; MAX OUT your 401ks, IRAs and get back in the market because we won't see prices this low for a long time. Folks, your 401ks and IRAs are for retirement and the funds should be put into guaranteed instruments. Most folks will still follow Wall Street and keep putting their money into SECURITIES. The word securities means; stocks, mutual funds, bonds, etc. When you think of the word SECURITIES you think of safe, growth and no risk. This is one of those oxymorons where the opposite can happen as to what we are led to believe. The year 2008 proved that the opposite can and will happen. Retirement funds should be in safe guaranteed instruments. These would be annuities and permanent life insurance policies. In my opinion, we haven't seen the bottom of this financial disaster and what I have read, we won't see employment pick up until 2013 or later. My advice; keep your funds on the side, either in CDs or savings accounts until there is definite growth in the economy.

I'm still waiting to see who will join me in the NIFTY FIFTY club.
