You’ll notice on the back page of this edition (the mailing page) there is our first ever paid-for advertisement for the new Poulsbo history book, “The Spirit of Poulsbo—Amid The Change...Some Things Remain”. Yes, I was part of the research committee for this book and what a great experience that has been! I have learned so much about our town and made lasting friendships at the same time. Hopefully, each of you already has your copy and, if not, will soon be purchasing a copy of this book from The Book Stop downtown. Believe me, you won’t be sorry. The author, Judy Driscoll, is very readable and the stories are short—which I know is important to some people! There’s quite a bit about our lodge in the book and pictures of several of our members including our own Earl Hanson (as part of the lodge as well as a young man with his best girl in the section on the Agate Pass Bridge!) GUARANTEE INCOME FOR LIFE

Many of us are hoping that this will be the turnaround year for the US economy. Our 401Ks and IRAs have recovered some of their loss from 2008. Will they continue to recover and post higher gains? Only time will tell. While we are hoping this will occur there is another financial instrument that requires examination. Unlike the stock market that has its ups and downs; the Sons of Norway annuities provide a safe and guaranteed income. If set up right, the income is guaranteed for life no matter how long you live. Some folks have part of their funds in CDs. This is fine if you need to be able to get to the funds right away, but if the funds are not needed for some time, why not transfer the funds to an annuity. With CDs, the interest earned is counted as taxable income for tax purposes, where as the interest earned in an annuity is tax deferred. This means that if the annuity is earning close to 5% tax-deferred, the CD would have to earn close to 7% taxable just to match it. I believe the rate now on some CDs is between 1-2%. The earnings on your CDs may also affect your Social Security income whereas the annuity has NO effect on your Social Security. Just a short note on Living Trusts. If you have a Living Trust with the AB trust provision where, upon death of the first spouse, the part of the trust that is exempt from Federal Estate Tax will bypass the surviving spouse and go directly to the trust beneficiaries, you’ll want to check your trust. In fact, what has happened due to the “NO Federal Estate Tax for 2010”, the surviving spouse receives nothing and all funds go to the other parties. Please examine your trust and get with your advisor to make sure you haven’t unintentionally disinherited your spouse.
