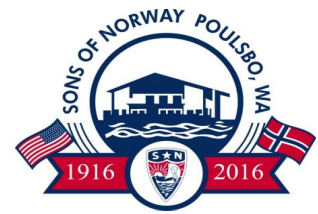

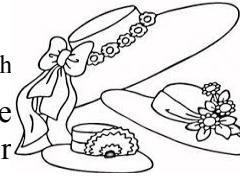
September 16
