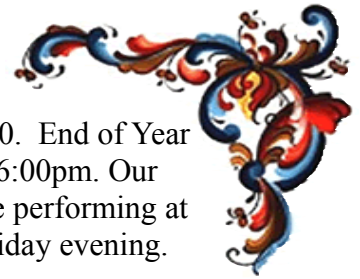

Thank you for writing to us, we love to answer your questions!!

First of all Syttende Mai literally means: Seventeenth of May. For all Norwegians it is a very significant date, Celebrating the [signing of the Norwegian Constitution](#) in [Eidsvoll](#), Norway May 17, 1814. (To help it's US equivalent is July 4th, Independence day.)



For those of us in Poulsbo [Viking Fest](#), celebrated on the third weekend in May, is when we salute that day and show our colors. Bunads and red white and blue ribbons are worn, with parades and parties celebrating this historic day! If you'd like to join us in celebrating this year we would love to have you!
