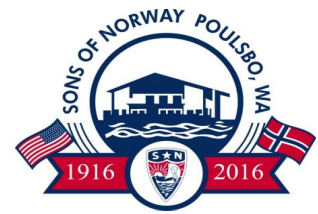

Landscaping Around the Lodge

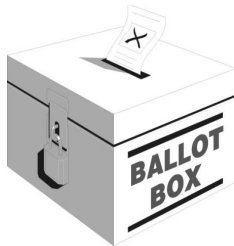

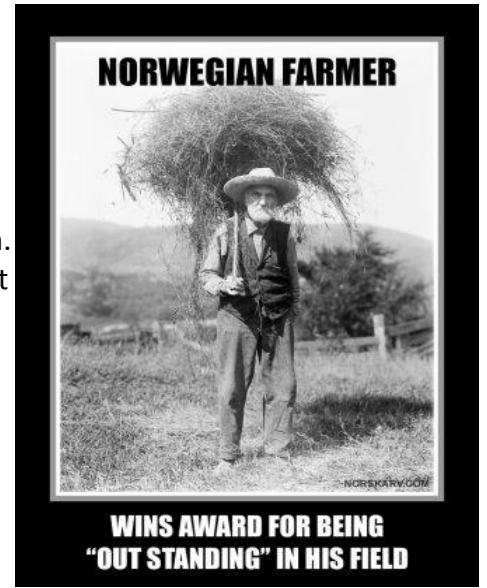
It's growing season!
