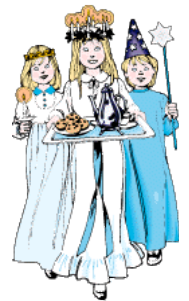

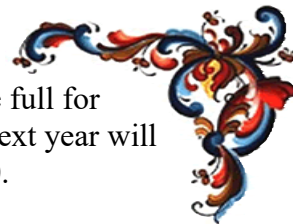
Ladies Club
